For patients (over 1 year old) to book to see a GP/Nurse about an urgent but not lifethreatening health problem that cannot wait until the GP is next open.

Problems include illness that started recently such as:

- Headaches
- Cough and colds, sore throat
- Earache
- High temperature
- Sickness and diarrhoea, tummy pain, constipation
- Insect bites and stings
- Minor injuries (where the skin is not broken and you can walk without help)
- Period pains, emergency contraception within 72 hours of unprotected sex
- Ingrowing toenails
- Backache, neck ache or joint problems
- Sprains and strains
- Skin rashes and infections

For urgent mouth problems / tooth infections (contact your dentist or NHS 111)

- Severe injuries following an accident
- Choking
